





# IMPORT + USE YOUR NEW LIGHTROOM MOBILE PRESETS!

First, you will need to download the Lightroom Mobile App from your mobile App Store.

Once downloaded, you will need to sign into your existing account or create a new account (it's free!)




## STEP 1: AFTER SAVING THE FILES TO YOUR CAMERA ROLL

Click on one of the presets (it's normal for them to appear blank or say "unsupported file"! They will show up once they are in Lightroom). Click on the export button up at the top and in the section where the apps appear, scroll until you see Lightroom. If you don't see Lightroom at first, click on the 3 dots at the end that says "More" and look at the suggested apps - Lightroom should appear there. Repeat this for each preset file.

If that doesn't work, another way that you can add the preset files into Lightroom is by saving the files to your camera roll (again, totally normal for them to appear blank/white). From there, you'll go into the Lightroom app and you'll see 2 icons in clue at the bottom right. Click on the icon to the left (the photo with the + sign), click on import "From Camera Roll", and you may have to wait a second for the files to load (you can "refresh" by pulling down on the screen) but once they do, you'll be able to add them as presets (they may show up black in the upload menu but once they are added you will see the name of the preset appear).

## STEP 2: OPEN THE LIGHTROOM APP

Open the Lightroom app and create a new folder: Click the + at the top right. Name your folder “Wayfarer Presets”




## STEP 3: IMPORT DNG FILES

Next, click on the 3 dots on the “Presets” folder and click “Add Photos.” Then, click on “Camera Roll” and select all of the DNG files and add them into the album.


## Step 4: ADD PRESETS

Now that you have your presets added into Lightroom, select one of them. Wait until the cloud icon at the top right corner has a green checkmark. This means the preset file has fully loaded and it's ready to save! Next, tap on the 3 dots icon at the top right of the screen and then tap on "Create Preset."



## Step 4: CONTINUED

Name the preset after what the file says (ex. Cali 1). You can choose to create a folder for these presets by clicking “User Presets” and then clicking “Create New Preset Group” at the bottom. Name the folder “Wayfarer Presets.” If you don’t want to make a folder, that’s fine. They will automatically save under “User Presets”



Repeat this step for each DNG file, as you will need to save each preset separately. Don't worry though, you'll only need to do this once! (NOTE: Don't forget to add each preset to the new folder you created, otherwise they will default to the "User Presets" folder.

## Step 5: USING YOUR NEW PRESETS

Select an image in the Lightroom Mobile App that you would like to edit. Swipe left on the bottom options until you see "Presets" and tap on that option. It will open with your most recently used preset collection. By tapping on the collection name, you can choose the new collection you just installed.

Click through the presets until you find the one you like. When you are finished adding your preset, click the check mark in the lower right corner.

## FINAL THOUGHTS

Please note that because every image is different, you'll often need to make basic tweaks to settings after applying the preset such as brightness, temperature, etc.


All of these tweaks can be made within Lightroom.

# MOBILE EDITING CHEAT SHEET

## EXPOSURE

Exposure is the first tool to adjust when editing with Wayfarer Presets. I tend to not add much, or any, exposure to my preset settings since every image is shot in different lighting conditions.


In the “Light” Tool, slide the Exposure setting to the right to brighten your photo, or slide it to the left to decrease brightness.



## VIBRANCE

If you want the colors in your photo to pop more, slide the Vibrance tool to the right. If you want less color in your photo, slide the Vibrance tool to the left.

NOTE: It's better to increase vibrance rather than saturation because it protects skin tones and prevent posterization (which occurs when colors are so maxed out that transitions are destroyed, creating a blocky look)



# MOBILE EDITING CHEAT SHEET

## ADJUSTING SKIN TONE


If your skin tone has a red or yellow tone, you can fix this by adjusting the red and orange color tools under Color > Mix.

To change the intensity of your skin tone, adjusting the orange and red saturation and luminance tools will achieve the best results.


Decrease saturation for a natural color and decrease or increase luminance for your liking to adjust how tanned or fair your skin looks.

Lastly, if a preset is applied and black colors appear washed out, specifically for those with Black skin, you can adjust this by going to the Light tool and adjusting the Shadows by pulling the slider to the left.

# IMPORT + USE YOUR NEW LIGHTROOM DESKTOP PRESETS!


## STEP 1: OPEN LIGHTROOM CLASSIC

On a PC, go into Lightroom and click on Edit at the top (next to File), then click on “Preferences.”

On a Mac, click on the Lightroom tab (to the left of File), then click on “Preferences.”

## Step 2: PREFERENCES

There will be a new screen that opens up and there will be several tabs at the top. Click on “Presets” (the second tab). Then, click on the box titled “Show Lightroom Develop Presets.”



## STEP 4: IMPORT .XMP FILES

Double click on “Settings.”

Copy and paste the folder from your download that holds the .xmp files into this folder. Note: All of my presets come in zip files, so please unzip your download first.

That’s it, you're done! If Lightroom was open when you copied over the preset files, you will need to close the program and restart it.
